

## How to do Current Affairs?

- Avoid cutting news like minor accident, suicide news or with vulgarities.

What is this about?	Record-breaking temperatures and months of severe drought have fuelled a series of massive bushfires across Australia.
When?	13 Jan 2020
Where?	New South Wales and Victoria
Who is involved?	Two people and an estimated 25,000 koalas were killed.
Why? (Reason)	Australia's climate has warmed by more than one degree Celsius over the past century, causing an increase in the frequency and intensity of heat waves and droughts.
<b>Consequence/</b> Effect/ Solution (any one)	The blazes turned skies orange and made breathing the air in Australia as bad as smoking 19 cigarettes.
